Grass Cutting In the Parks

J.J Enterprises (17 McRae Beach South) is looking after cutting and trimming the grass in both parks as per the following schedule: [In May, June and July, 4 times per month. In August, September and October, 3 times per month.] As many of you are aware, the parks we enjoy belong to the Estate of Thomas McRae. Wanting to keep the deeded right of access to such parks in the hands of those who live or cottage on the original McRae farm, we, as an Association, have agreed to look after the upkeep on such lands.

Welcome Newcomers

We extend a hearty welcome to all who have made McRae Beach their permanent or summer address since the 2010 season. As a reminder to those of us who have been around for some time and FYI to our new arrivals:

- Georgina Township requires dogs to be leashed or otherwise restrained at all times.
- Parking and camping within our parks are prohibited.
- The speed limit on Blue Heron Drive, McRae Beach South and all side streets is 40km/h.
- When on/in the water PLAY SAFELY! Swimmers and sailboats always have the right of way.
- All docks, boatlifts, etc. are to be out of the parks and in the water, or on your own property by June 24. This will assist the grass cutter to do his job and park users to pursue their enjoyment of this space.
- For safety reasons and the pleasure of all, no vehicles are to be left in the parks. Please park along the road or return your car to your dwelling after launching.
- The first 30 meters (100ish feet) from the shoreline are deemed restricted and as such boats and PWC operators are reminded of the need to keep their speed down to 10km/hr when entering or exiting this area. Many residents have placed buoys at the 100' mark to assist in identifying the swimming area.

Did You Know?

COTTAGE LIFE ARTICLES FROM THE PAST YEARS

During most of the year, there is no such thing as under using a conventional septic system. Given minimal or sporadic use your system will tick along at a low level of activity. It could even sit unused for a decade and still work fine once you start using it again. The anaerobic bacteria will re-establish themselves when there is waste to work on. Remember- have your septic tank inspected and cleaned every three to five years. Don't put garbage or food waste down the toilet as it will decrease the effectiveness of your septic system.

Mosses and lichens are hardy-that's why they're all over cottage country. The only earth friendly way to get them off your wood is elbow grease. [a good scrubbing brush and some lake water] These growths won't cause your wood to rot but they do absorb moisture making rot more likely. Wet lichen can cause slippery surfaces.

Those fertilizers that allow you to grow bigger flowers are the same ones that will cause a proliferation of noxious weeds and algae to bloom in the lake when they eventually make it to the lake.[it doesn't matter whether you use synthetic or organic fertilizer] Planters on or near the lake are problematic if you allow fertilizer to run through them into the lake.

New dishwashers are highly efficient and use much less water and detergent than even the most careful hand washer, which means less grey water going into your septic bed. Whether you wash or use a machine, you'll make the least impact on the environment by choosing a biodegradable detergent that is free of phosphates and chlorine. Use phosphorus-free products for personal hygiene too.

If all Canadians limited their shower time to just 3 minutes, it would save approximately 800 million litres of water each day for a total of 5.6 billion litres of water a week or 292 billion litres of water a year.

Windmills on Georgina Island?

Ten, 80 metre windmills will soon be seen on the northeast side of Georgina Island. Once these windmills are connected to the province's power grid, they will produce power to 7,500 homes and displace 15,000 tonnes of green house gases annually. - 1. Grass cycling can help your lawn choke out weeds by denying them the light and air. Leaf mulch helps retain moisture in soils by reducing soils exposure to sun and wind and slow evaporation.
- **2.** Rainfall and over-watering can cause excess pesticides and chemical fertilizers to run off via storm drains into our waterways, where they can harm the health and habitat of fish and aquatic organisms.

- **4.** Mulch is most effective if it is 2-3 inches deep, leave a space around shrubs and trees.
- 5. Low flush toilets cut 50-80% of water per flush.
